After school, four days a week, students receive special instrument instruction and get academic help from Kendall-Whittier teachers at no cost.

Harmony Project Tulsa (HPT) is a multi-year, music-based, after-school mentoring program that gives daily academic tutoring, string instrument instruction, and music lessons to local at-risk students in pre-k through sixth grade.






MAKING A COMMUNITY INVESTMENT
